Agenda Item 5: Earthquake Brace + Bolt Update

Recommended Action: No Action Necessary

The Earthquake Brace + Bolt (EBB) program offers homeowners in eligible ZIP Codes with qualifying house characteristics an incentive payment of up to \$3,000 to help pay costs associated with seismically retrofitting their houses.

2015 EBB Program

For the 2015 program, as of May 9, 514 retrofits have been completed. There are 16 retrofits still in-progress and final documentation is expected by June 1. This will close-out the 2015 EBB program.

2016 EBB Program

Homeowner registration for the 2016 Earthquake Brace + Bolt (EBB) program opened on January 20 in 18 cities and more than 100 ZIP Codes. EBB plans to do 1600 retrofits in 2016 and the first 1,000 will be funded by the \$3 million provided by the State of California via the Department of Insurance.

Approximately 3,200 applicants were accepted into EBB on March 15. All other applicants were notified that they are on the wait list. Homeowner Packets were mailed to every homeowner accepted that included:

- EBB Program Rules
- A Step by Step document outlining how to complete the retrofit and receive payment
- A packet, including the Program Rules, for homeowners to give their contractor to help ensure a proper retrofit

Homeowners have until May 15 to receive a permit. As of May 9, 441 permits have been received and 67 retrofits have been completed.

Training building department staff on Chapter A3 continues.

2016 Napa EBB Program (FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program)

The Napa EBB program, funded by FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, will retrofit 100 houses in 2 ZIP Codes. A total of 257 Napa homeowners registered for the program.

As required by the HMGP, EBB provided Cal OES the registrant information, including flood mapping. The list was approved by FEMA.

100 homeowners were accepted into Napa EBB on May 2 and they have until July 1 to receive a building permit for their project.

Additional Funding

We continue to look for additional funding for the EBB program to expand incentive payments to more homeowners. The number of homes in need of retrofits far exceeds the level of funding we have available at this time.

The CEA has been invited to submit an application for additional Hazard Mitigation Grant Program funds available following last year's wildfires. Due on June 16, CEA will request a federal grant of \$1.8 million to be combined with a CEA match of \$ \$600,000. This grant would fund 600 residential retrofits in Humboldt and Santa Barbara counties.

We do not know whether the State of California will continue its support for EBB funding in 2017.
