¹ FEMA revenue is direct reimbursement based, so revenue is adjusted monthly to match FEMA incentive payments paid.

² CRMP was awarded an additional \$80 million for FEMA 4308 in March 2022. The updated grant provisions related to FEMA 4308 allow for reimbursement of \$3 million related to administrative costs of administering the \$80 million dollar grant. The bulk of the administrative costs are for salaries, which are a CEA Mitigation expenditure, and therefore not reimbursed to CRMP, and not included on this budget report. Requested reimbursements for CRMP directly incurred expenses (such as marketing) are included.

Agenda Item 6: 2023 CRMP Proposed Budget

Recommended Action: Board Approval Needed

Background:

CRMP annually presents its program and operational budget for approval to the Governing Board.

Analysis:

Staff has prepared attachment A to assist the board in reviewing the proposed 2023 budget for the CRMP. This attachment compares the 2023 proposed budget to the 2022 actual expenses as of October 31, 2022.

The increase in proposed expenditures is directly related to expected increase in incentive payments for the various grant programs. Grants to homeowners are \$5,360,830 for the ten months ending October 31, 2022. The 2023 proposed budget for grants to homeowners, for all programs, is \$26,720,000. Additional information regarding the breakout of the grants is listed on attachment A.

Total budgeted program revenue for 2023 is \$29,720,000. This revenue will primarily come from grants received from FEMA to cover consumer incentives payments made by CRMP. The grants are received on a reimbursement basis, and the 2023 projected revenue represents the projected consumer incentives that will be processed in fiscal year 2023. This revenue will be recognized monthly based on monthly incentives paid.

In addition, CEA Mitigation will be contributing \$3,000,000 in 2023 to the CRMP. The \$3,000,000 contribution will be used to cover administrative and operational costs that are not covered by the FEMA grants, and any other potential cash-flow needs of CRMP during fiscal year 2023.

All other activity is consistent between 2023 and 2022.

Recommendation:

CRMP staff recommends approval of the 2023 CRMP Budget, as presented.



CRMP Earthquake Brace + Bolt Programs

Although the number of completed retrofits had started to slow because EBB has nearly completed all retrofits in the HMGP 4344 grant, overall, more than 18,161 have been completed. Application submittal from our other programs is now starting to pick up. The funding for the HMGP 4407 EBB program has 1,666 grants available, of which 623 are completed, and 966 are in-process. All retrofits available in the initial HMGP 2019 DR-4308 grant (1,337) have been completed. CEA was awarded an additional \$80M under the HMGP 4308 grant and with the additional funding, the HMGP 2021 DR-4308 program has 21,072 grants available (18,043 main grants and 3,029 supplementary grants). There are 391 retrofits completed and 3,823 in-process, with 1,332 supplemental grant recipients in-process. The remaining 22 waitlisted supplemental grant applicants were brought into the program on October 27, 2022. Our most recent registration just ended, with over 19,600 homeowners registering to participate. The CRMP-funded program, with 1,000 grants available, has 599 retrofits completed, 1 currently in-progress and no extensions. This program will remain open while there are FEMA-funded programs available to allow applicants who started work prior to approval an opportunity to receive a grant.

Funding for retrofits have come from CEA for the CEA Brace + Bolt (CEA BB) Program for policyholders, which is now closed to new registrations; and the Cal OES-administered FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP), the Loss Mitigation Fund (LMF) and the State for the retrofits completed in the Earthquake Brace + Bolt Program (EBB).



EBB staff continue to be busy working from home since the last board meeting (August 10th – November 28th):

- 8,657 Incoming Calls (119 calls/day)
- 5,052 Outbound Calls
- 3,602 Emails Answered
- 1,143 Applications sent to FEMA
- 1,113 Retrofits Completed

In addition to phone calls, emails and applications processed, staff continue to work with CEA IT to roll out the updated backend database system, enhancements for the supplemental grant initiative, bug fixes, and development of the Earthquake Soft-story program.

Future Funding Opportunities

CRMP continues to look beyond present funding sources—the primary source has been the CEA Earthquake Loss Mitigation Fund—for additional funding sources, including the Cal OES-administered FEMA *Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)* and *Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities* (BRIC) grants.

EBB Program Contractors

Of the contractors on the EBB Directory (Directory), 381 have completed at least one retrofit. As contractors withdraw from the Directory, licenses are not renewed, or a contractor has not completed the training, a discrepancy between registered contractors and contractors on the Directory may occur. Eighteen contractors have joined the Directory since the last board meeting and nineteen contractors who had previously completed retrofits in the program have fallen off. All current contractors have been contacted and encouraged to update the ZIP Codes in which they are willing to work.

EBB Northern and Southern Regional Differences

Retrofit costs in Northern California have increased slightly since the last report, from \$5,558, which was comprised of retrofits completed in earlier grants, to \$6,169 and remain more expensive than Southern California. In Southern California, there was a slight decrease in the average cost from \$5,076 to \$5,042 in the 2021 program. The Executive Director will provide additional detail in her executive report and future data.


The cost of retrofits within specific ranges remained stable during this reporting period. For all retrofits completed, 9% cost less than \$3,001. Of the completed retrofits 3% were under \$3,001 in Northern

California and 13% are in Southern California. A total of 48% of the completed retrofits cost less than \$5,000. A further breakdown of this data shows 22% of completed retrofits were in Northern California and 68% in Southern California. A total of 77% of all retrofits cost less than \$7,000, 61% in Northern California and 90% in Southern California, and 93% cost less than \$10,000.









Engineered and Non-Engineered Retrofits

Engineered retrofits continue to be substantially more costly than non-engineered retrofits. With 14 engineered retrofits completed in the 2021 program, the average cost increased from the previous quarterly report from \$9,600 to \$12,559. Non-engineered retrofits have increased slightly from \$5,257 to \$5,377.

Withdrawn Applications and Completion Rates

During each program cycle, a significant number of applicants withdraw from the programs. The percentage of withdrawn homeowners for the 2021 program is almost evenly distributed between the two regions, which is different from the 2019 program, but continues to be lower in Southern California. The completion rate for the 2018 EBB program was 45%. The rate for the 2019 and 2020 programs will not be calculated

until the programs close. Given the delay in accepting homeowners into the 2019 program and the current economic impact of COVID-19, EBB is unsure what to expect for the 2019 and 2020 FEMA-funded completion, but as additional retrofits are completed it appears the completion rate may be impacted.

Other Items of Interest

- HMGP DR 4407 The Earthquake Soft-story Program funded by HMGP 4407 is under development and is expected to open for registration in early 2023. 36 ZIP Codes are confirmed as a part of the pilot program in the following Northern California Counties: San Francisco and Alameda (Cities, San Francisco, Berkeley, and Oakland). In Southern California, Los Angeles County cities of Los Angeles and Pasadena have confirmed they will participate, with ZIP codes to be confirmed within the next month.
- CRMP was notified in early August that the 2021 \$20M BRIC grant submitted for a multi-family, softstory program was moved to Round 1 of the process. The application is currently undergoing review by FEMA's Environmental and Historic Review process and further programmatic evaluation. Funding is anticipated to be approved.
- CRMP is working with marketing contractors, ZOOM and KP Public Affairs, on a contractor outreach
 plan, expected to launch first quarter of 2023. Outreach activities include providing free marketing
 materials and other resources to contractors currently on the EBB Contractor Directory, encouraging
 additional participation in areas where contractors trained in seismic retrofitting are few.
